8. PUBLIC HEARING

Mike Arnold opened the public hearing on the recommended Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2021. This public hearing has been continued from the July 31, 2020 special meeting. Darren Read, Board member, read a statement regarding the budget (see attached).

- There was no additional discussion on the fire fees.
- Additional discussion on recreation fees: The grant the district received from Boating and Water Ways for marina improvements requires the district to set aside 25% of fiscal year income for maintenance and capital improvements. Mr. Read suggested the district contact the Boating and Water Ways to clarify language on 25% set aside. Funding a position to do regular maintenance would be a better use for this money if allowed. There was discussion on collections of day use fees. Currently day use fees are not enough to pay for the cost of maintaining the facility let alone funding capital improvements.
- Additional discussion on sewer fees: The sewer was put in in 2007. There has only been one rate increase since then. Grant money has been used to do some of the maintenance work needed on the ponds/sewer. This is not enough to keep up with the maintenance and improvements needed. The district is required to maintain the system in the same condition they received it. An extensive fee study is being conducted.

SUBJECT: Recommended Budget for Fiscal Year 2020-21

I am submitting for your consideration, the Fiscal Year 20-21 Recommended Budget. The Recommended Budget is as accurate of a spending plan for the upcoming year as can be provided based on the numbers provided by Lassen County.

The District continues to face a number of future uncertainties. Some of the uncertainties include:

- Costs are increasing and revenue is not
- Collected revenue is not sufficient to plan for future capital replacement fund contingencies
- Tight budgets do not support the recruitment and retention of employees for the long term

Some of the notable budget changes for the 20-21 FY:

Miscellaneous

 All accounts are approximate and are subject to change. Our CPA is working with the County on current correct figures

Fire

- The Fire Department's annual budget is based on revenue generated through the Fire Department's parcel assessment fee
- The Fire Department had \$2000 set aside for administrative which is the departments contribution towards the direct labor hours of management, accounting and maintenance staff to process tasks for the department. Instead of moving these funds to Sewer Admin, I moved the funds to Fire employee salaries. When staff performs work for Fire, they can code their work hours to 225.
- The Fire Departments budget is not sufficient to fund the total annual needs of the department and future capital asset purchases.
- This budget does not sufficiently fund the department's annual insurance needs (workers comp/auto/liability)
- The budget does not sufficiently fund the department's annual vehicle fuel and maintenance needs
- The budget does not sufficiently fund the other department expenditures as well

Recommendation to save funds or create revenue

- Increase the annual parcel assessment for the fire department
- Get an insurance quote from a CSDA recommended insurance provider
- Cap the number of volunteer firefighters to reduce workers compensation benefit payments

Recreation

- The Recreation Department's budget is generated from collected parking and boat launch permit fees
- The 25% of FY income required for recreation maintenance is based on the 19-20 FY generated funds is \$2261. These funds will remain in the recreation Trust fund

Sewer

- The Sewer Department's budget is generated from collected annual and quarterly operations and maintenance fees from sewer system users
- No pay increases this FY, but there will be a required pay increase next FY due to the minimum wage increase
- The Sewer Departments budget is not sufficient to fund the total annual needs of the departments and future capital asset purchases.
- This budget does not sufficiently fund the department's annual maintenance for buildings, sewer system or improvements
- The budget does not sufficiently fund the department's annual special department expenses needs
- The budget does not sufficiently fund the other department expenditures as well

Recommendation to save funds or create revenue

- Complete the rate study and adjust the annual assessment accordingly
- Get an insurance quote from a CSDA recommended insurance provider
